2017 TIC Programs

The news for the Trout in the Classroom for 2017 is "some in some out" We have six programs that have been running in the years past and two programs that are trying to get up and running but have yet to do so. As far as I know right now, Greenville, Mercer, Farrell and West Middlesex schools have one aquarium

each running at this time. Farrell has had two in years past and has dropped down to one. Hermitage, our longest running and first trout in the classroom program has taken the year off of trout raising to renew their equipment, and will probably be back at it in a year or two. This can be a very involved program for the teachers as well as the students and taking a year or two off is understandable.

This is the kind of program that is run by the students and teachers, we as a TU Chapter are not really involved with the actual raising of the fish. It's one of those "no news is good news" kind of things. And I haven't heard much other news.

After a couple of bad years with reports of some schools losing all their fish at times and even having replacement fish shipped to them it actually can be very stressful to run this kind of a program at a school when you actually have limited time to devote to it. But we hope to have two additional programs up and running in the next few years, maybe more.

Last year our chapter purchased an extra chiller to have on hand in case one of the schools has a problem and loses theirs. The chiller is a very important part of the process. If they lose a chiller it is very difficult to keep the water at a constant cool temperature. It's a lot of messing around with ice and a very difficult procedure. So now hopefully, if there is a problem, we can have a working chiller in their possession in a couple hours.

PATU provides a grant program to support the classroom needs, and helps to educate the next generation on cold water conservation. The PATU grant program assists teachers in replacing outdated or non-functioning equipment, books, field and sampling equipment, as well as funding field

trips to engage students in coldwater conservation activities.
